Lincoln Community Christmas Parade and Market has been happening for over 40 years; a community event celebrating all things Christmas and community.



After the parade the Woolston Concert Brass Band will perform at 11am on the green behind the library. And the Lincoln Primary School band will perform under the oak tree by the library after the parade.

# Lincoln Community and Residents' Association Incorporated

Lincoln Residents held a meeting in the Todd lounge, Lincoln Event Centre, on Monday 6th November 2023. This was a public meeting to progress the establishment of the Lincoln Community and Residents' Association Incorporated.

Matter discussed at the meeting:

- Constitution The Constitution as tabled was approved for the establishment of a Lincoln Community and Residents' Association and dated 6 November 2023.
- Future Planning After general discussion it was agreed to ask the Lincoln Community what they want a Community and Residents Association to achieve in respect of the purpose and culture of the Association.

#### Points of discussion:

- Use of media Facebook, Lincoln Community Newspaper, Selwyn Times.
- Lincoln University Students Association have six editions of their RAM magazine.
- Send an email to groups within the Community to let them all know about the Lincoln Community and Residents' Association. Let the groups know the Association is there for them and ask them to make suggestions and share ideas, for forward planning.

- Create a Lincoln Community and Residents Association Facebook Page, with links to the already established Lincoln Community Facebook Page. This page would inform residents of meetings, matters for discussion and the meeting Minutes each month would be posted.
- The Residents Association needs to promote Lincoln and be an advocate between the residents and the Selwyn District Council.
- Funding When the legal entity has been formalised funding applications can then be made to continue the work of enhancing the Lincoln Community and advocating on the residents' behalf. Rātā/Rotary/Lincoln Community Trust, Selwyn District Council Community Grants, were suggested.
- Areas already undertaken by the dis-established Lincoln Community Committee, should still be noted when the new Committee is formed. There are some long standing items still awaiting resolution.
- There should be a 'drive' to get new membership. A stall at the weekly Lincoln Farmers' market, one Saturday a month, to inform residents, was suggested.
- Long term planning The Residents need to have the opportunities to consult with the Selwyn District Council on what the community needs.

The committee welcomes any comments and feedback or any matters of interest you have to share with the community. Have your say about what you think.



# **Rotary Club of Lincoln turns 50**

Lincoln Rotary

The Rotary Club of Lincoln has been serving the community since it started in October 1973. Currently, the club has a membership of around 60 which is still growing.

The anniversary formal dinner was held at Lincoln University on 28th October, 2023. More than 100 members, partners and guests enjoyed this major milestone. This included a few charter members and in particular, the club's first president, Graeme Sim who gave his reflection about the first ten years of the club. This was followed by other senior members talking about the major highlights from each decade till present.

Rotary South Island District Governor, Phil Gully, said in his address that Lincoln Rotary is the biggest club in the Rotary District 9999, and its contribution to wider Rotary activities is impressive.

"By all measures, Lincoln is a highly successful club; many of the things we do are made possible by the money we raise. Through such efforts, the club supports



the primary and high schools in the area, Community Care Association, Child Cancer and more. A new initiative from Lincoln Rotary Club is *Love Your Locals* which invites people to give back their time or money for the community in need. The Club also has a focus on youth and has spawned a local Rotaract Club."


At international level, Lincoln supports the global campaign for polio eradication as well as projects for the Pacific Islands. So far, Rotarians and Rotary Clubs around the world have contributed an estimated \$2.2 billion towards the eradication of polio.

During the evening, contributions made by a few members were recognised. Selwyn Mayor, Sam Broughton was awarded a Paul Harris Fellowship, a prestigious Rotary International award. This was in recognition of Sam's contribution to Selwyn District.





# lincoln envirotown community gardens

As this will be my last monthly report for 2023, I would like to review another successful year. First, we are pleased to have an assurance from Te Whatu Ora that we can continue to use the former Lincoln Maternity Hospital as our location for the foreseeable future.

Our Saturday morning workshops have continued to prove popular, with participants from as far away as Ashburton and Rangiora coming to learn new gardening skills. We particularly appreciate our regular attendees. Twelve topics were presented during the year, including composting, worm farming, bonsai techniques, improving garden soils, fruit tree pruning, basic vegetable growing, rose maintenance, backyard biodiversity, and bulb propagation. A new workshop topic this year was "Making the best of your garden or outdoor space" by young landscape architect, Nathan Campbell.



Thanks to Lesley Hurst, an educator from the "Bee Awesome" programme, we now have an active hive located in the Community Gardens. This has provided an opportunity to add bee-keeping workshops to our calendar of events. However, recently the bees departed from the hive, but fortunately, Lesley was able to locate a swarm of bees and capture them to replenish our hive. We are gradually learning more about the behaviour of bees and how to look after them. This is a great topic for attracting young people to the Community Gardens.



The Lincoln Kidsfirst Kindergarten children and teachers continue to visit regularly to tend their plot. In addition, we have been pleased to host visits from Lincoln Brownies and Guides, Tai Tapu Primary School, and Lincoln Primary School.

On 7th November I attended the AGM of the Canterbury Community Gardens Association, which now has over 50 affiliated gardens. The meeting in the spacious grounds of New Brighton Community Garden provided an ideal opportunity for networking with folk from other community gardens, and to go away with plants and other gardening items that had been kindly donated by local businesses.



I greatly value the efforts of our dedicated group of volunteers who enable us to keep the Community Gardens tidy, productive, and an interesting place to visit. We meet on Thursday afternoons. In addition, Mike Geayley, Gordon Boyle, and Marcus Durkin have undertaken specific garden projects, for which I am very grateful.

# **Happy Christmas from Selwyn Community Patrol**

Thank you to everyone who has supported the patrol this year. This includes all of our patrollers both present and past and our fabulous sponsors without whom we cannot run an effective patrol. It has been an amazing year of change and growth. At the start of the year, we welcomed a brand-new committee and also increased our coverage and effectiveness in our local area with the addition of a brand-new patrol in Rolleston. This has allowed the current patrol to focus more on Prebbleton, Lincoln, as well as Leeston, Tai Tapu, Springston, Southbridge.

We have had all the usual every day running of the patrol such as keeping the patrol vehicle up to scratch; installing a base radio in the car; purchasing super bright new torches for patrolling; upgrading all the medical gear in the car and getting our defibrillator checked and certified. In addition, we have recruited and trained 21 new patrollers! We have patrolled 9,822kms and covered 893 hours so far this year. We have also helped the police at specific events such as on the 2023 Election Voting Day, and at community events such as the recent Diwali Festival of Light event at Lincoln Event Centre.

Looking forward to the New Year 2024 we have a lot of plans. We will be looking to significantly increase our patrol hours, so if you have ever considered volunteering then please do consider volunteering with us. There are so many positives - from helping keep our community safe, to meeting a great new bunch of people who all have the same interest at heart, to learning new skills. Our minimum time requirement is a three-hour patrol once a month, at a time that fits with you and your lifestyle. We have day, evening, and even late night/early morning patrols for those who are night owls. You always patrol with another person as your safety is our biggest priority. The new year also brings a replacement patrol car - a brand new hybrid Toyota Rav 4! We will be introducing a tablet-based report system to be used in the car when patrolling, and hosting more training courses for our own patrol and the other patrols across Christchurch.

To finish this year in style we are hosting a fund-raising sausage sizzle at the Lincoln Christmas Parade on December 9th – so please visit our stand for a few good old sausages in bread! We will also have our very first float in the Christmas Parade, as well as the patrol car - so keep an eye out for us, Charlie the dinosaur and friends!

# Blokes – need some space or help to build your project or looking for conversation? Come to the Lincoln Men's Shed!







Do you have a wooden or metal project but you don't have the space at home, tools or the exact know how? Then the Lincoln Men's Shed is the place for you! It is also a great way to gain knowledge, make new friends and provide a place for men to speak to men, have conversations that only men can have within themselves.

Members can come along to the Shed and work on their own personal projects, or if men are new to this work and need a helping hand, there are others there to give them guidance. The Men's Shed accepts people with any skill level, from complete novices to someone who has been a tradesman or engineer. It offers great fellowship and even if you haven't got any experience, the guys there are prepared to help you. Many find that they can up-skill and work on projects that they wouldn't have otherwise attempted, or if they worked on a project at the Shed or at home, but didn't get it quite right, they can get help to fix it.

The Lincoln Men's Shed are also very big on helping build items that the community may need, e.g. at present they are working on some picnic tables for the Lincoln Scouts. Previously, they have built a vege shed for the Lincoln & Districts Community Care, as well as benches for the Lincoln Bowling Club made from timber salvaged from a bridge on the Little River Rail Trail. If you need something made or repaired, get in touch as they can help with that too – one project was an old tatty set of drawers that had come off one of the early ships that had arrived in New Zealand. Two members worked together and came up with a pretty good finished product at the end. Another worked to restore an old rocking horse. They just ask customers to pay for the materials used and a small cost to cover overheads like insurance and electricity.


With a growing membership, the Shed is a busy place with hammers banging, saws humming and lathes rotating, but with the new extension that saw the Shed double in size, it has more than enough space for everyone. The Shed has a huge range of tools, equipment, power saws, wood turning and metal work areas, along with some great work benches for assembly that all can use.

Much of the Men's Shed's funding comes from donations and community grants. It is open Monday, Tuesday and Thursday from 1–4.30pm and is located at the end of Meijers Drive behind the Lincoln Event Centre. They would ideally like to see it open more, e.g. even four days a week and maybe on a Saturday or an

evening so people who are not retired and working can still come.

Their youngest member is Fraser McDonald aged 14 years, who comes along with his grandfather (who ensures that he works in a safe manner). Fraser has loved woodwork since his eyes lit up at the woodwork cupboard at Lincoln Kindergarten, aged 3 years, and since then has always been making something. At barely 11 years old, he made his first outdoor coffee table and now makes outdoor furniture such as Jack n Jill seats and other items that he sells under his Serious Sawdust NZ Facebook page. Coming to the Men's Shed after school allows him to expand his projects because of the equipment that he is able to access and gain further knowledge. Not every teen would be safe at the Shed, but if you have a talented teen and have someone who can come along with them, then please contact us and we can have a chat.

To join the Lincoln Men's Shed, there is a small annual payment and then a gold coin to cover afternoon tea costs. It will be shut for three weeks, from the week before Christmas, opening again mid-January. For further information please contact lincolnmensshed@gmail.com
