# Po you love to dance? Come along to our FREE Have-a-Go Zumba Gold classes!

As part of the Selwyn SWELL Festival Justine is hosting TWO FREE Have-a-Go classes on Friday 20th October and again on Friday 27th October at 9.15am at the Lincoln Event Centre. These two classes are for people to learn some basic steps – you can come along to one or both of these one-hour classes.

"Some people are scared to start. They say 'oh I don't have any coordination' or 'I'm not sure of my fitness' but co-ordination and fitness comes with practise. Many older people are much more capable than they think and we definitely see people becoming more mobile over time with this class. Starting with a friend can help people overcome their reservations. The class has a cardio, strength and balance component as well as co-ordination which is great for cognitive health. There is a lot of research coming out that suggests dancing is one of the best exercises for older people because it exercises the mind and body at the same time, as well as being very social."

Zumba Gold is not just for the ladies. Overseas, Zumba is danced by everyone, men and women alike, but for some reason here in New Zealand trying to get men to participate is difficult. Justine is actively trying to encourage more local men to come along and dance so she has an offer of two months of FREE classes for any men who want to come along to any of our classes (Zumba Gold or Zumba Fitness).

# **Growing for Goodness' Sake**

"I'm in it for the goodness" says Don.

The goodness he speaks of is multi-faceted: raising money for good causes, the joy of pulling together as a team for a common goal, enjoying the buzz of fair day, mingling with the locals and sharing his knowledge, the satisfaction in seeing the results of his efforts and happiness on the faces of those who have managed to grab a gem – not to mention the good feeling he gets just from gardening!

His sentiments are echoed by all those on the plant fair team, who speak of the joy that comes from seeing something good come from doing something they love. Together, they have over 500 years of gardening experience with many of them learning the art from their parents and grandparents, and they love the opportunity to use those skills to benefit others.

The Lincoln Anglican parish consists of five worship centres (Lincoln, Rolleston, Tai Tapu, Greenpark and Springston) and the annual fair is an opportunity for parishioners to join together. Last year over 100 people were involved in the running of it, together contributing many hundreds of hours. And that's not only time spent growing plants and working on the day – some put their skills to work in the kitchen, baking and preserving, while others make handcrafts and refurbish garden equipment.

The parish fair has been in existence in some shape or form for at least 67 years. Early records show that, amongst other things, the fair consisted of stock drives, heavy produce and a "Topdressing Afternoon Tea"!



On May 25th 2022 the Canterbury East Federation of Women's Institutes gathered to plant a Kowhai tree that all Federations were given to commemorate 100 years of Women's Institutes in New Zealand. The trees were to be planted in the Federation's area.

We had a bit of a struggle as to where we could plant our tree and eventually the Selwyn District Council agreed to let us plant it at the turn around in Jimmy Adams Terrace, at the beginning of the walkway behind the new school. We fully understood that we were responsible to the upkeep of the tree, and that the time of planting the Council would not be responsible to any damage done.

The tree was starting to grow and was still in place around the middle of June this year, but was missing by the second week of August. We contacted the Council to see if they had any information on the missing tree and they didn't, neither did the people who mow the grass when they were asked. A nearby neighbour was asked and he hadn't seen anything untoward either.

All we are left with is the plaque. The tree and two solid stakes are all missing.

The sad thing to this story is that since the tree was planted, the Canterbury East Federation of WI is no longer active and we feel very disappointed with this theft.





# lincoln envirotown community gardens



On 14th September we held our open day, which had been postponed from Matariki week. We were pleased the children of Lincoln Kidsfirst Kindergarten came along to do their first planting of the new season. Members of Selwyn Timebank, Millie Hu, representing the Selwyn District Council, and Rachel Vogan from the Canterbury Community Gardens Association came along. During the afternoon the glasshouse was cleaned and replenished with new compost. Compost was also spread on the plots to reinvigorate them for the new season.

We believe in making our community gardens environment attractive, as well as productive. Scarecrows have been important members of our gardens team for many years, but they suffer from the ravages of sunshine and rain, and must be replaced eventually. This month we welcomed our new friend, as yet unnamed, created by Lisa from *Clothes by Portia* (with assistance from Portia the dog).



At *Clothes by Portia* Lisa's mission is to keep your dog feeling fabulous with New Zealand made timeless, sustainable products. She is based in Lincoln where she designs and makes t-shirts, hoodies, bandanas, sailor bows, tutus, etc. Her creations have 5-star reviews commenting on her quality and how comfortable the dogs are wearing her products. She can custom make items to fit your dog. *Upcycled by Clothes by Portia* is an initiative she is proud of that is helping to stop items of clothing from ending up

in landfills. Lisa will take your item of clothing, such as a hoodie, trackpants, or a t-shirt, and she'll create something fabulous for your dog. Check out her website **clothesbyportia.co.nz** and support local.

In my last monthly report I quoted from Stuart Farrimond's book *The Science of Gardening* about the benefits of gardening and the role of soil organisms in promoting our health. However, I must emphasise that, in getting close to the soil, compost and potting mix it is important to protect ourselves from potentially dangerous organisms by wearing gloves and a protective mask, and washing our hands thoroughly after working in the garden. This is standard practice in the Community Gardens – note the Kindy kids are wearing gloves. If compost or potting mix is dry, we wet it to lock in air-borne organisms. Before 1976 no-one had heard of Legionnaires' Disease (why is it called that?), but this risk to human health and life from contracting this disease is very real. Hence these sensible precautions. (Check out *Legionnaires' Disease* in Wikipedia).



The recent *All About Bees* workshop was a great success, with 25 adults and 15 children attending. The children keenly donned beekeeper suits to enable them to get close to the hive. Because of the pleasing response, Lesley Hurst has agreed to conduct another workshop on 25th November. Children very welcome!

With the shop prices of most vegetables remaining stubbornly high, there has never been a greater incentive to "grow your own". Our annual *Veges 101* workshop, to be held on 11th November will provide an opportunity for people to become confident to start their own vegetable garden.




