

Strong growth in student enrolments in 2024 for fifth year running

Te Whare Wānaka o Aoraki Lincoln University has increased its student population significantly for the fifth year running in 2024, continuing the University's strong growth trajectory since 2019.

Enrolments for Semester 1 2024 are 20% higher than Semester 1 2023, and the University is on track to exceed 5,000 students by the end of the year.

The growth in Equivalent Full-time Students (EFTS) has been 21% for domestic EFTS and 13% for international EFTS, with a 58% increase in postgraduate EFTS.

Vice-Chancellor Professor Grant Edwards said the strong growth signals Lincoln University's increasing influence in shaping the future of the land-based sectors in Aotearoa and globally.

Our graduates are equipped with the knowledge and skills to contribute direct to industry, and our employment outcomes remain high, at 84%.

"Increasingly Lincoln's education and research programmes are leading positive and impactful change in the land-based sectors in an era where all sectors of society are demanding the application of more efficient and sustainable production practices that safeguard the environment and intergenerational wellbeing."

In a continuing trend for Lincoln University, the number of postgraduate students in Semester 1 2024 has reached 43% of the total student population, a significant shift from the pre-Covid era.

This statistic is a feature of specialist universities and signals Lincoln's status as a research-intensive land-based university.

Professor Edwards explained that the shifting ratio of Lincoln's student population toward postgraduate study underscored the leading role the University is playing in moving New Zealand's land-based sectors towards a more resilient and sustainable future.

"The strong surge in our postgraduate numbers demonstrates our strategic approach to addressing and anticipating industry demand for skilled graduates, while also meeting the needs of a cohort of students who are qualified and motivated to contribute to society by applying their skills and knowledge.

"Many of our postgraduates have been drawn to Lincoln University through our specialist land-based education programmes and research projects which enable them to pursue a new direction, realise a career change or develop a new pathway to work satisfaction. We are proud to play our part in enriching the lives of these students and preparing them to bring significant and lasting benefits to their communities."

Lincoln University's financial outlook remains positive, with a modest surplus realised in 2023 and budgeted for 2024. The University remains debt-free and retains a healthy cash position to enable continued advancement of its extensive capital development programme to support its student experience and research environment.

Professor Edwards also cited Lincoln's much-vaunted campus life as a factor in the University's popularity with incoming students: "Underpinning everything we do at Lincoln University is our outstanding student experience, where our students begin their journey to lifelong success within a thriving and inclusive student community and a vibrant, diverse and enriching campus environment."

The top programmes for students attending Lincoln University in 2024 are: Bachelor of Agricultural Science, Bachelor of Commerce (Agriculture), Bachelor of Land and Property Management, and Master of Applied Computing. In close collaboration with land-based sectors, Lincoln University launched the Bachelor of Sustainable Tourism and Master of Parks Management in 2024.

National Science & Technology Forum helps young people choose their career path

The Lincoln Rotary Youth Committee has several programmes for youth - from primary school through to young adults. The committee considers individual requests to assist with trips to sports tournaments. world competitions and other events. We also facilitate the selection of candidates for the local Totara Award, the Rotary National Science and Technology Forum in Auckland, and the Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA). Moreover, Rotary Youth Driver Awareness (RYDA) is a safety programme aimed at 16 to 18-year-old students who are approaching that crucial time in their lives where they start to drive independently, or travel as passengers of novice drivers. As a committee we enjoy working along our youth helping them maximise their potential and reach their goals.

The Rotary National Science & Technology Forum is an opportunity for students in Year 12 who enjoy Science, Mathematics and/or Technology subjects and who are consider-

ing a career in these fields to join other New Zealand Secondary School students to find out about opportunities available to them. The two-week programme runs annually at the start of January in Auckland and the Lincoln Club helps to fund part of this experience for the successful candidates. This year we were delighted to send Farah Aladem, a Year 12

student at Lincoln High School, to this event.

From Farah's report: "the forum was a safe haven for 160 students from across New Zealand, in which they built life-long connections, learnt valuable lessons, and were given a sense of direction and purpose in life."

Farah also writes: "going through the biomedical science, biological science, and the molecular biology modules truly ignited that spark for biology that I previously had within me."

"It was truly an honour being able to represent Lincoln on a national level, at such a prestigious science forum, and I couldn't have done it without support."

In Super Mayor, players embark on a journey to solve community issues, engage with residents, and ultimately ascend to the coveted position of mayor. Game developer Ben Childs says the game's focus is on participating in both realistic and hilariously far-fetched Council projects and meaningful decision-making from developing and funding public facilities to resolving weather-related challenges.



"The game is designed to be genuinely challenging and fun while educating players about how Council works and how their vote really matters. The Council's Executive Director of Community Services and Facilities, Denise Kidd, said the Council was eager to support the Youth Council's efforts in this initiative. "Local government plays a vital role in New Zealand's democracy, providing a platform for residents to voice their opinions on what makes their district or city a great place to live, work, and play. This game will be a valuable tool in engaging our young people and building interest and understanding in local government and Council processes," she said.

- Repairing and assembling a swing set for a Lincoln solo mum.

- Making a child's table and chairs for sale.

Members have also spent several weeks splitting firewood. This has been a big task but is a profitable fundraiser for the shed. The next development for the shed is to install a shedwide dust extraction system rather than separate systems for each machine.

We are currently at the peak of production for apples, pears and peaches. The pesky codling moth loves to drill into our apples and pears each season, and they have returned once again (but the fruit still tastes fine). However, by covering the trees with netting, the wasps have been less evident in fruit damage this year.

We value the microclimate provided by the hedges and trees surrounding the community gardens. The downside is that as they grow, the amount of sunshine reaching some plots falls. We have appreciated the hours of work that Gordon Boyle has spent trimming the trees and disposing of the debris. Well done Gordon!



Speaking of apples, I recently visited David Mathieson's garden to admire his set of apple trees. These have been trained to grown as espaliers on horizontal wires along a north-west facing fence. This sunny, sheltered location has enabled an excellent harvest of fruit to be achieved. Forcing the branches to run horizontally encourages fruit production rather than have rampant vertical shoot and leaf growth. Apples and pears are ideal for espaliering because their branches are flexible and they fruit repeatedly on the same spurs.

Last month we hosted a group of Japanese students from the Southern Cross Language Institute, accompanied by their teacher Lesley Hurst. Lesley, who is also our expert from Bee Awesome, talked to the group about bees and demonstrated how hives are designed. The students donned protective clothing to view the hive close-up. They also spent time inspecting the Community Garden, and learning about its role in promoting sustainable living.



One of our volunteers, Rachel, is a first aid instructor. She kindly offered her services to conduct a basic first aid training session for us to ensure that we are better prepared for accidents. Barbara tried her hand at using a defibrillator.

Selwyn Timebank group learn about recycling and waste management

A group from Selwyn Timebank recently visited the ReDiscover Waste and Sustainability Centre outside of Rolleston. An introduction to how different materials break down in a natural environment led down a different pathway for the intended workshop!

There was great interest in how our waste is managed. What can and can't be recycled? What needs to be thrown away? What is considered green waste? There were many questions and quite a few surprises for those who attended. The means of separating into three groups (landfill, recyclable and green waste) was discussed. Some items were assumed to be recyclable, but the answer was a sure no on a closer look at what it was made from. Other things could be recycled because what it was made from would ultimately be separated. A video was watched on this whole process - and what a lengthy process it is! The results of the formation of landfills and what happens to recycled materials were also presented.

A guided tour was embarked upon of the Pines Resource Recovery Park, where areas are highly organised into recyclable material and other waste. In the soon-to-be future, a second-hand store will be open to the public along with other possible exciting plans, in the hope it will become a central hub for helping to recover the environment. There is already a community garden underway which has become a valuable educational resource.

Finally, the visit included making beeswax wraps to take home.

There is so much to learn about what we can do better in our own homes. Each participant admitted that they learnt something new and will endeavour to put into practice what they took on board. 



Who was Ebenezer?

We wondered too about the origin of the name of Ebenezer Drive in Lincoln. Remembering a local character, or a nod to Dicken's Scrooge?

A Rosemerryn representative explained more. All streets in the area are named after features in Arthur's Pass National Park and wider Southern Alps / Kā Tiritiri o te Moana, for example after



Halpin Creek, Temple Basin, and Whitehorn Pass. Ebenezer Peak which is in Westland is closely linked by name to Mount Teichelmann, and Teichelmann Peak, Rock, Creek, Corner, and Track. All named after Dr. Ebenezer Teichelmann, 1859-1938, Australian born surgeon, Medical Superintendant of Westland who worked at Hokitika Hospital from 1897-1926. Known as 'The Little Doctor" he was also a celebrated climber, explorer, and photographer. His climbing companions did not always appreciate helping with his weighty glass plate camera gear, but always appreciated his superb photos.

After meeting Greville's party surveying the Franz Josef Glacier, he was amused to find his name attached to a small nearby peak, saying, "Fancy a peak being saddled with a name like Ebenezer!"

He is also remembered for his considerable conservation efforts, including work towards establishing Arthur's Pass National Park, and locally a survey of Port Hills vegetation with Leonard Cockayne, which led to the development of Scenic Reserves there.

He enlisted in 1915 and at the age of 56 embarked for overseas service with the Medical Corp. On his way from Egypt to France he survived the tragedy of the sinking of the H.M.T.S. Marquette when so many lives were lost.

It's worth reading more about him in his biography by Bob McKerrow, or the usual online sources. You can view many of his photographs in the online collections of West Coast NZ History, (westcoast.recollect.co.nz), Ka Kohika Macmillan Brown and via Digital NZ.

On a clear day, when you stand on Ebenezer Drive you can see both the Port Hills and all the way to the Southern Alps and wonder if he would have thought, "Fancy a road being saddled with a name like Ebenezer."





Time to have a say on your future Selwyn

Selwyn residents are being urged to make their voice heard on proposed plans for the district's future, as the Selwyn District Council adopted it's draft Long-Term Plan (LTP) for public consultation.

The Council adopted the draft plan at an extraordinary meeting in March, ready for public consultation to begin on Tuesday 2 April.

The draft LTP 2024–2034 sets out the Council's proposed work programme, including key projects and services that would be delivered in the district over the next ten years, how the programme would be paid for and its effect on rates.

The draft LTP has been informed by more than 800 people who shared their priorities for the district with Council last year.

Mayor Sam Broughton says the plan focuses on the key priorities identified by the community in growing a 'Sustainable Selwyn', that supports people to live here at all stages of life and preparing for growth, balanced against increasing costs to deliver Council services.

"This Long-Term Plan is about looking after what we have while continuing to think about the future and provide for growth.

"This has to be balanced with increasing costs that we, and councils across the country, are facing. Just maintaining existing infrastructure costs 30% more than three years ago."

Residents are asked to have their say on three big decisions: proposed public transport infrastructure upgrades; how Council

should proceed with the Waihora Whata Rau project to build Ellesmere's new library, council service centre and community facility next to Leeston Park and upgrade the park; and whether a new recreation and sports centre at Darfield should be built to meet growing demand.

Other matters being consulted on include a proposal to close Sheffield Memorial Pool, increasing Council's role in supporting economic development and exploring new digital solutions to improve customer experiences.

"We want to hear from all residents in our district and I invite you to look through the proposals and tell us what you think. This Long-Term Plan will impact our district's future so we want to get the balance right," Mayor Broughton says.

The draft plan proposes a rates increase of 15.6 per cent for the 2024/25 year, with an average increase over the next ten years of 8.5 per cent.

Residents will be able to have their say on the draft LTP 2024–34 and completing the online submission form from 2 April – 2 May 2024.

Teaching Opportunities with Selwyn's Sister Cities

The Council's Sister City Committee has been asked by two of our Sister City partners to help recruit teachers to work overseas.



Toraja, Indonesia

Toraja is Selwyn's Sister City in the highlands of Sulawesi, Indonesia. It is a coffee growing, mainly Christian community. In 2019 three retired Selwyn teachers spent time working with Junior High School English teachers to assist their teaching practices. Last year one of the Toraja teachers spent three weeks in Selwyn mainly at Rolleston College, observing teaching and learning.

Barana Christian Senior High School now seeks three or four retired Selwyn teachers, or teachers on sabbatical, to spend three to four weeks in their school helping to further develop an English environment for their students.

Teachers would pay their own way for travel and insurance, but accommodation, transport and tourism activities would be paid for by Barana Christian community. September is the preferred month weatherwise.

Toraja is culturally unique with traditional long houses, coffee grown by small farmers and buffalo that are an important aspect of funeral processes.

Lanzhou City University, China


Lanzhou City University is seeking full time English teachers to join their staff. Lanzhou is in the Gansu Province in northwest China, situated on the Yellow River.


